Ortro will also feature tacos -- with tortillas made from non-GMO organic white corn and sourced from New York City. Catfish, crispy tofu, mahi mahi and lobster are among the fillings.

Carl Helgersen, the chef at Otro, is also preparing tapas, many of them using seafood, like Mussels, Garlic Shrimp, Crispy Sardines, Octopus and Clams in Green Sauce, along with others like Patatas Bravas (spicy cubed potatoes) and Olives with Aged Goat Cheese.

And there are several types of paella, which are made-to-order and might take as much as 30 minutes to prepare. All are made with calasparra rice, saffron, and onions and peppers, and variations include Mariscos (clams, mussels, shrimp and calamari), Chicken and Green Olive and Vegetarian.


