**What if this virus is an ally in our evolution?**

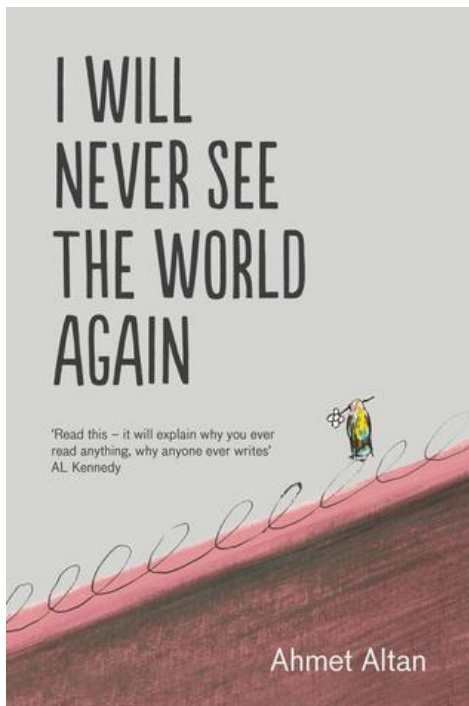
**In our remembrance of what it means to be connected,
