



REFUGEE SEWING

Well, I was all ready for refugee sewing to start the third session of the 2023-24 year on February 29. My trunk was packed with all of the supplies needed to start projects: fresh thread, fiberfil for making pillows, various nice fabrics recently donated, a machine for a recent refugee who doesn't need lessons, etc.

Unfortunately, Mother Nature hit us with a major blizzard. Multiple Central New York schools were closed, including Syracuse City Schools. If the schools are closed, sewing class is closed. So my day started with texting all of the new students about the closing; my students don't necessarily speak or read English, but most know how to translate texts. Then I emailed all of my teachers in case they don't pay attention to school closings.

But I expect that class WILL start on March 7 and visitors are always welcome. We're at 501 Park Street on Thursdays from 12:15 to 2:45. Call to let me know you have arrived.



I continue to give machines and supplies to refugees who already know how to sew. Abilities vary from making quite simple garments to advanced tailoring skills. Two recent gentlemen said they worked in tailoring shops, one in Kabul and one in Turkey where he lived for ten years after leaving Afghanistan. I give these people the more advanced tools that have been donated. My list now has 104 names since July 2022 of those who have requested machines. I constantly give thanks for the generous donors who welcome the stranger to this country by providing working machines and a wide variety of sewing supplies. The refugees are grateful.
